The Rhodes Scholarships are funded by the estate of Cecil J. Rhodes and are considered one of the oldest and most prestigious international scholarships for outstanding scholars from any academic field of study.

Rhodes Scholarships are tenable for postgraduate studies or a second bachelor's degree at Oxford University, for two years with the possible extension for a third year. The Scholarships cover all approved fees (such as matriculation, tuition, laboratory fees, and certain other set charges), in



Cecil Rhodes's will specifies four selection standards:

- Literary and scholastic attainments;
- Energy to use one's talents to the full, as exemplified by fondness for and success in sports, athletics, community, art, etc.;
- Truth, courage, devotion to duty, sympathy for and protection of the weak, kindliness, unselfishness, and fellowship; and
- Moral force of character and instincts to lead, and to take an interest in one's fellow beings.

In short, Rhodes Scholarship selection committees will be seeking young people of outstanding

. The Rhodes Scholarships support students who demonstrate a strong propensity to emerge as "leaders for the world's future."



: You must be a Canadian citizen or a permanent resident of Canada. Applications from refugees/asylum seekers currently residing in Canada will also be considered in this constituency.

: You must be domiciled in Canada.

: i. You must be aged 18-23 on 1st October 2024 (i.e. you must have been born after 1 October 2000 and before 2 October 2006).

OR (for older candidates who completed their first undergraduate degree later than usual)

ii. You must be under the age of 27 on 1st October 2024 (i.e. have been born after 1 October 1997) AND you must also have completed your first undergraduate degree on



: You must have completed an undergraduate degree (usually a Bachelor's) by July 2025, and you must have an academic background and grade that - at a minimum - meets or exceeds the specific entry requirements of your chosen course at the University of Oxford

Candidates will have a higher chance of successful admission to Oxford if they have:

A First-Class Honours Degree or equivalent, or,

A GPA of 3.70/4.0 or higher

University endorsement is required to compete for the Rhodes Scholarships in Canada. To receive endorsement, you must first submit your application to the UCalgary Rhodes Committee for review.

The deadline is August 11, 2024. The application should be submitted as a single PDF file through the <u>application form</u> on our website.

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What makes a competitive application?

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A full curriculum vitae (CV) which should include specific details about academic qualifications, prizes, scholarships, positions of leadership, employment positions, involvement in student, voluntary, community or political activities and any cultural, musical or sporting accomplishments. This should not exceed two letter size pages in length with a minimum 12 pt font."

Other items to include: research and publications; certificates; memberships and affiliations



In your personal statement of up to 1000 words, we ask you to address each of the following prompts by weaving them into the narrative of your statement (the word allocation across the three is up to you):

- 1. Tell us how you overcame a challenge in your life. Which Rhodes Scholar character qualities did you draw from? What did you learn from the experience?
- 2. What would you like to learn from and contribute to the Rhodes community in Oxford?
 - 3. From your place in the world, how will you use your energy and talents to



For all candidates: list references and include professional or institutional affiliation

3 or 4 of the references need to be faculty members who have taught and graded you in your studies.

If you have a research supervisor who has not taught and graded you in a course, they can still provide an academic reference.

The other 2 or 3 references will write about your character and involvement in extra-curricular, service, or leadership activities.

Never include people to whom you are related



Bachelors Masters: MSc, MPhil, MSt, Master Taught/Master Research [no third-year funding] Master of Philosophy [possible third-year funding] DPhil MFE (Financial Economics) and MBA

Start your application early Reach out to referees Have courage to submit your application!

Rhodes Application is (likely) due before any other applications you will be submitting for graduate/professional school.
