The APPC approved the changes to Academic Regulation temperature on Principles of Conducted L. Integrity in Scholarly Activity, the University Calendar effective for the 20202021 Calendar.

Approval of Changes to Academic Regulation I.3 Reappraisal of Academic Assessments (Final Grades) the University Calendar

The APPC reviewed the proposed changes, which increase the number of grade reappraisals a student can obtain in a given year from two to three, and stipulate that successful grade reappraisals are not counted towards the total number of academic assessments udent can appeal in a given year.

The APPC discussed which assessments are eligible for reappraisal under this regulation, learning that any assessment returned after the last day of classes qualifies.
