4. <u>Remarks of the Chair</u>

Ed McCauley, Chair, included the following in his remarks:

- x Members for whom this is their last General Faculties Council (GFC) meeting were thanked for their contributions: James Steele, Graduate Students' Association (GSA) President, Kirsten Neprily, GSA Vice-President (Academic), Shaziah Jinnah-Morsette, Students' Union (SU) President, Sandra Amin, SU Vice-President (Academic), and several of the SU Faculty representatives. Incoming student members present to observe the meeting were welcomed.
- x The 2024 Night of the Dino event was held April 8, 2024. The achievements of Dinos athletes were celebrated, including recognition of 177 Dinos students who are Academic All-Canadians.
- x The School of Public Policy's Simpson Centre for Food and Agricultural Policy has been granted \$1.2 million from the provincial government to fully launch the Alberta Digitization Agriculture program to increase adoption of digital technologies in Alberta agriculture
- Provincial government support for a new rural physicians training program, a collaboration between the University of Calgary and the University of Lethbridge, was announced on April 3, 2024
- x The team that facilitated a safe last day of classes on April 9, 2024 was thanked for their efforts
- x University researchers have been very successful in receiving Tri-Council grants this year, with the number of Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC) grants up, including SSHRC Insight and Partnership grants

- x On March 18, 2024, Kimberlé Crenshaw, Law professor at Columbia University and the University of California, Los Angeles, spoke on the topic of race and gender intersectionality as part of the University's Courageous Conversations speakers series
- x The U15 Provosts recently met, and topics of discussion included student engagement, research security, and civility in the workplace
- x The University's team has been working collaboratively with the provincial government and other post-secondary institutions to develop a process to manage the provincial attestation letters and have been delivering these to both credit and non-credit international students since March 1. Because the province was so quick to have this implemented, Alberta was one of the first provinces to be able to start delivering these letters, giving prospective students confidence they will be supported.
